Fetal Alcohol Syndrome Disorder (FASD) is a condition caused by prenatal alcohol exposure (PAE) and affects children's development and mental health throughout their life. Approximately 2%–5% of Australian children are affected by this condition.

This webinar will describe FASD and its impact on each area of child development. This will be followed by a discussion of indicators that can support the early identification of children at risk of developing mental health concerns. The principles of effective support will also be discussed alongside exploration of available support and resources for children, families, and supporting professionals.

Who should attend? This webinar is suitable for any social workers who work in children's services, welfare services, and/or school settings.

Allied health professionals, counsellors, community workers and school support staff are also encouraged to attend.
